

## 2020-2021 IAMRA Membership and Programs Committee Charge

The Membership and Programs Committee reports to the Management Committee and operates under the following charge.

1. The Membership and Programs Committee will assist the Management Committee to achieve IAMRA's Goals\* as set by the Management Committee from time to time.
2. The Membership and Programs Committee's work program will include, but not be limited to the membership-related objectives and targets set by the Management Committee, including tasks related to adding value to IAMRA membership. Currently, these objectives and targets are as follows:
  - a. Increase membership in under-represented areas (e.g., Central and South America, Asia, Pacific, Europe, non-English-speaking Africa)  
Targets:
    - Membership of French medical regulatory authority and Francophone countries
    - Increase partner membership of those involved in medical education and training
  - b. Identify key IAMRA resources that should be offered in other languages (website and conference content)  
Target:
    - Translation into French (simultaneous, on-screen or hardcopy, of opening speeches and keynote presentation at the next IAMRA Conference)
  - c. Facilitate opportunities for interaction among IAMRA members via website, webinar, events, and social media and make selected content available to non-members  
Target:
    - Develop and offer a monthly program of webinars
  - d. Provide members with relevant and useful guidelines and policy statements  
Target:
    - Develop a statement on regulation in relation to the provision of virtual healthcare
3. The Membership and Programs Committee will also advise the Management Committee on any other matters it considers to be relevant to the pursuit of IAMRA's Vision, Goals, Objectives and Targets.
4. The Membership and Programs Committee will provide regular reports to the Management Committee and a report to the Members General Assembly.

\*IAMRA's current Goals, are as follows:

1. Creating a global community of medical regulators by expanding IAMRA's membership, partnerships and impact, and increasing value to members;
2. Supporting and encouraging members to provide, in the interest of the public, regulatory practices and systems that strive for best practice and contribute to the provision of safe and effective health care by the medical profession;
3. Leveraging technology, i) in pursuit IAMRA's purpose, including the sharing of fitness to practice/disciplinary information among IAMRA members; and ii) guiding members on the adoption of technology in regulation and healthcare.
4. Strengthening the evidence base for regulation by encouraging research and evaluation of regulatory processes, and the publication and sharing of findings.
